Young trade unionists call for action on youth employment at the International Labour Conference 2012

Open Space "Decent Work for Youth – Lost in Globalisation?"
Berlin, 6-7 October 2011

Youth unemployment is a critical issue in all countries. Youth unemployment rates, already high, understate the problem as they exclude those discouraged young people who are no longer seeking work. Young people are also over-represented in temporary and other form of precarious work.

With 45 million young people forecast to enter the labour market every year for the next decade, youth unemployment represents an economic and social threat, often called as a "social time-bomb".

Trade unions across the world are pressing governments to adopt macro-economic policies which put employment at the centre, as well as specific measures to improve the access of young people to decent jobs and quality education and training. Trade unions also need to do more to reach out to young people, to keep their concerns at the top of our own agenda both in terms of government policy as well as protection in the labour market and the workplace.

The International Trade Union Confederation and the Global Unions federations have called on the G20 to respond to this crisis and develop a "Youth Jobs Pact", building on the ILO's Global Jobs Pact. Additional support could come from the tripartite special task force on youth employment, set up under the current G20 French Presidency

The urgency of such an important and pressing issue has been recognised and should not only be addressed by the G20 or governments but by all the actors of the world of work. The International Trade Union Confederation is pushing to place an item on youth employment at the agenda of the next International Labour Conference. If successful, youth participation should be ensured, to reflect their views and recommendations in the discussions.

On the occasion of the World Day for Decent Work, the participants of the Open Space "Decent Work for Youth – Lost in Globalisation" are calling on:

- Governments: to act urgently to get job-creation moving, to maintain economic stimulus where it is needed rather than to cut public expenditure,
- National trade union centres: to include young people in their delegations at the next International Labour Conference,
- Trade union solidarity support organisations: to support youth participation at the next International Labour Conference,
- the International Trade Union Confederation: to involve its youth networks in the Conference's preparatory work concerning youth employment and to connect with other relevant actors (ILO-ACTRAV, GUFs).





The creation of private universities and the defunding of the public universities generated one of the most expensive educational fees of the world: a degree can cost more than USD 8,000 per year and the minimal salary (that many people earn) is USD 350 approx. The poorest people are forced to resort to private banks for credit to study in private universities.
